In Arizona, just 16% of voters elected our new governor. With one phone call, the governor-elect was able to raise over 3.5 million dollars which was the amount his opponent raised by making 2000 phone calls.

The League sponsored 5 forums for statewide positions - Attorney General, Governor, Sec.of State, Supt.of Public Instruction and the Arizona Corporation Commission this fall. We had to cancel the forums because half of the candidates refused to participate. Our conclusion was they felt they didn't need to meet with the public (those they represent) because their out of state advertizing was giving voters all the information they needed to know the candidate.

Having a group in Texas making an ad for Arizona candidates without even contacting the candidate or consulting with the candidate doesn't enhance the voting process or democracy.
